Background

History:

- Program operated in a leased facility under an exemption from Field Act.
- With the passage of AB 114, the County Mental Health Department withdrew from the current site and was not going to renew its master lease.
- KCSOS wanted and needed a Field Act compliant facility that was safe and educationally appropriate on a long-term basis.

Program:

- Provide services to students that have extreme challenges with their behavior and designed to prepare student to return to a less restrictive environment.
- · Developed to avoid non-public school or residential placement.
- Team of Educators: Mental Health Professionals, Program specialists, School nurses and instructional aides.


