Juan Mireles

Director, School Facilities and Transportation Services Department California Department of Education

Juan Mireles leads the School Facilities and Transportation Services Division (SFTSD) at the California Department of Education. The SFTSD is responsible for ensuring that school districts in California design plans and select school sites that are safe and educationally appropriate pursuant to regulatory standards. In this role, Juan also oversees California's annual participation in U.S. Department of Education Green Ribbon Schools (ED-GRS) and administration of the state initiative, California Green Ribbon Schools. These programs recognize schools and districts that demonstrate excellence in whole-school sustainability—reducing environmental impact and cost, improving health and wellness, and delivering exemplary environmental and sustainability education. Additionally, Juan oversees the Office of School Transportation (OST) which develops the training curriculum for the safe and efficient transportation of students. The OST is also charged with training instructors and monitoring the instruction of the approved curriculum.

Prior to joining the California Department of Education, Juan worked in the Education Systems Unit within the California Department of Finance where he managed budget and policy development for school facilities, charter schools, and teacher credentialing.

Juan also spent over 16 years working at the Office of Public School Construction (OPSC) which administers California's school facilities bond program. Prior to leaving OPSC, Juan was the Deputy Executive Officer managing the grant programs, policy development, administrative functions, and project expenditure reviews.

CHAPTER 406.

As act to add a new section to article two of chapter three of title one of part three of the Political Code to be numbered three hundred sixty-two of relating to the establishment of a division of school planning in the state department of characters and making an appropriation therefore. Hapveved by the Governe May 10, 102. Th. need-aby 22, 102.1]

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

Section 1. A new section, to be numbered 3829, is breely sweeners, added to article II of chapter III of title 1 of part III of the Political Code, to read as follows:

\$829, First.—The department of education shall have traversely and the stable better than the state of the stat

- Division of School House Planning created in 1927
- Established in Political Code Section 362g
 - (a) Establish standards for school buildings
 - (b) Review plans and specifications for all school buildings outside cities, which have building codes

Current Statutory Authority (1 of 2)

Education Code Section 17251

(a)"...advise the governing board (of a school district) on the acquisition of new school sites...(and) give the governing board in writing a list of the recommended locations in the order of their merit, considering especially the matters of educational merit, safety, reduction in traffic hazards, and conformity to the land use element of the general plan..."

Current Statutory Authority (2 of 2)

- (b) "...develop standards for use by school districts in the selection of school sites in accordance with the objectives set forth in subdivision (a)."
- (c) "Establish standards for use by school districts to ensure that the design and construction of school facilities are educationally appropriate and promote school safety."

State Superintendent of Public Instruction

- Tom Torlakson's term ends after eight years as SSPI
 - In 1998, worked with former Assembly Speaker Bob Hertzberg now serving in the State Senate – to co-author the Prop. 1A school bond
 - Strong supporter of the School Facilities Program throughout his career
 - Strong supporter of Proposition 51
- New SSPI after November elections

Tips for LEA Preparedness: Administration

- Review and update your comprehensive school safety plan
- Designate an emergency coordinator
 - Be prepared for donations (cash, materials, etc.)
 - Manage grant and other funding applications
- Build contacts and relationships with your local Emergency Operations Center (EOC)
 - Get to know your school liaison at the county EOC
- Boards prepare sample emergency resolution and delegation of authority

Tips for LEA Preparedness: Mental Health

- Be prepared for mental health needs of both students and staff
- Needs assessment: What is capacity of LEA before an emergency?

Tips for LEA Preparedness: Recordkeeping

- Keep records!
 - Back up all key information
 - School closures
 - Number of homes lost
 - Student mobility
 - All programs: child care, after school, nutrition, etc.
- School facility inventory
 - Take pictures of the "before" condition of your schools

Tips for LEA Preparedness: Communications

- Collect cell phone numbers for administrators, principals, staff
 - Keep key phone numbers handy, in multiple places
- Establish a phone tree or other method of emergency communication
- Have communications/press materials ready in draft form
 - Prepare in multiple languages
 - Social media

County Offices of Education

- Can serve as conveners
- Best practices
 - Send daily update email to administrators
 - Use web site to show closures throughout county in one place
 - Coordinate efforts and services that may benefit more than one LEA

Drinking Water for Schools

- Drinking Water for Schools Grant Program
 - SB 828 provided \$9.5 million to improve access to and the quality of drinking water in schools.
 - Only \$1 million allocated
 - Projects for schools within, or serving pupils from, a small disadvantaged community, as defined in Section 13193.9 of the Water Code
- Lead Testing for Schools
 - All community water systems are required to test school drinking water upon request by school officials.





Recruitment (1 of 2)

Two Steps

- Exam for Field Representative (Consultant) – Soon
- 2. Those applicants passing exam and meeting minimum qualifications are eligible to be interviewed for positions.

Recruitment (2 of 2)

Minimum Qualifications

- Credential or Masters or Doctorate in Education, Public Administration, or related field.
- 2. Three years of administrative or supervisory experience in one or a combination of the following:
 - A. A position with responsibility for two or more systemwide programs in a public school district, or one or more systemwide programs of the office of a county superintendent of schools, or one or more statewide or regional programs of a State educational agency.
 - B. A position with responsibility for a major school facilities planning and construction
 - C. A position responsible for preparing and presenting studies, proposals, reports, and other documents on behalf of public school districts in the areas of planning and constructing school facilities.
